Chapter further covenants and agrees that upon termination of its affiliation with Society for any reason, or whenever required by Society, Chapter shall cause itself to be dissolved or, at the direction of Society, shall cause its name or form of organization to be changed; and that no amendment to its Articles of incorporation or change in its name or purposes shall be made without consent of Society.
- 3. Society covenants and agrees that it shall not at any time seek to enforce against Chapter any obligations, duties or liabilities inconsistent with the Constitution and By-Laws of Society.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of these Resolutions be forwarded to the Society together with copies of proposed Articles of Incorporation and Corporation By-Laws, to serve as an application by this chapter for Society approval of our plan of incorporation.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF BLOOMINGTON CHAPTER NO. 1 OF SPEBSQSA. INCORPORATED

- 1. NAME: The name of this organization shall be the Bloomington Chapter No. 1 of SPEBSQSA, Incorporated, a corporation without stock and not for profit, organized under The General Not For Frofit Corporation Act of the State of Illinois.
- 2. OBJECTS: The objects of this organization shall be:
 To perpetuate that old American institution, the barber shop quartet. To promote vocal harmony and good fellowship among its members. To render, through the medium of good singing, altruistic service to community in which it is located. To perform all acts necessary to carry into effect the purposes hereinbefore set out.
- 3. MEMBERSHIP: Any male white resident of Bloomington or the immediate vicinity, who is interested in the aims and purposes of the Society, is eligible to be considered for membership.
- 4. DUES, FRES AND FISCAL YEAR: The initiation fee shall be \$3.50 for each member, in return for which the member shall receive from the Chapter a membership certificate and a membership pocket card. The annual dues shall be \$12.00 per member, subject to change only by a majority vote of the membership (See Section 8). The fiscal year shall start July 1st.
- 5. OFFICERS: The officers shall be President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer. These three officers shall be elected from the membership of the Chapter for a one-year term at the annual business meeting, which shall be held in April of each year, shall take office on July 1st, and shall perform the usual duties of their offices. At this same meeting there shall be elected from the membership of the Chapter for a one-year term a representative to serve on the Board of Directors of the Illinois District Association to which this Chapter belongs, such representative to take office on May 1st and perform the usual duties of that office.
- 6. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS: The Executive Committee shall constitute the Board of Directors and shall consist of the officers, and nine other active members of the Chapter, to be appointed by the President immediately after the annual meeting. This Committee shall function as the governing body of the Chapter. Matters of special importance shall be submitted to the membership of the Chapter for action.
- 7. NOMINATING COMMITTEE: The President shall each year, on or before March 15th, appoint for the annual meeting a Nominating Committee of three active members, which Committee, through its chairman, shall present to the membership a slate of three eligible and qualified officer candidates, consisting of one for each office (See Section 5). Additional nominations may be made from the floor.
- 8. AMENDMENTS: Amendments to, or changes in, this Constitution may be made by a majority vote of assembled members at any regular meeting of the Chapter, providing notice of the proposed amendment has been given to the membership at least seven days in advance.
- 9. BUSINESS MATTERS; Matters of business, other than those already provided for, may be acted upon at any regular or special meeting of the Chapter. Proper notice of any special meeting shall be given by the Secretary.
- 10. VOTING FOWER: Each active member in good standing shall be entitled to one vote on all matters acted upon when he is present.

11. SUPERVISION BY INTERNATIONAL SOCIETY AND BY DISTRICT ASSOCIATION: This Constitution, and any subsequent amendments thereto, as well as all rules and regulations of the Chapter, shall be subject to approval of the International Executive Committee of the Society and the Board of Directors of the Illinois District Association of Chapters.
